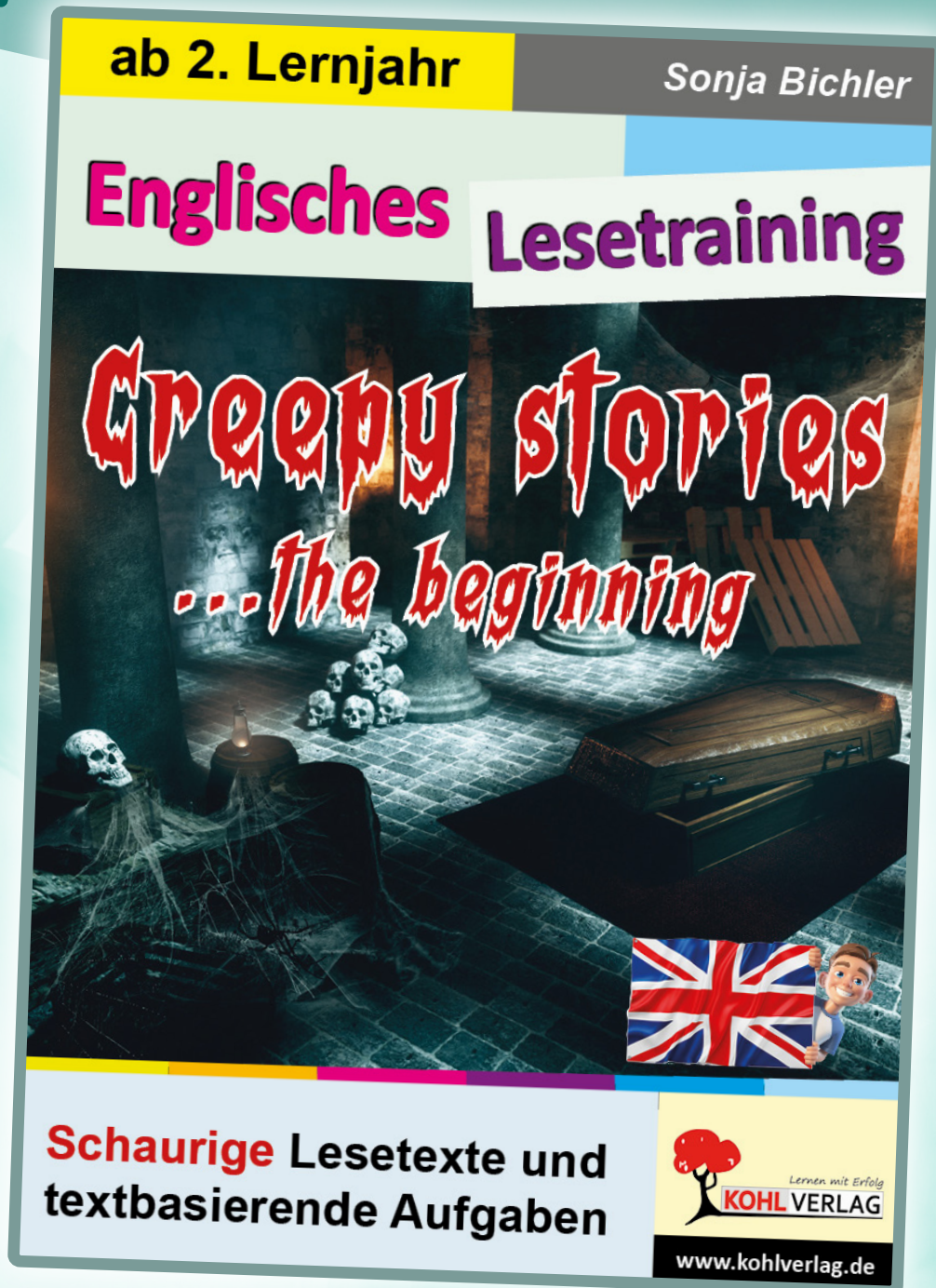


# Bloody Mary
